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Little as our friends of the Peace Society believe it, England has even in her wars of late years done much to expect the glorious title given in the Beatitudes to the Peace makers. Sir ANDREW CLARKE, Governor of the Straits Settlements, whose policy has just been unanimously approved by his Legislative Council, has proved beyond a doubt the efficiency of gunboats in securing respect for the peaceful awards of an impartial arbitrator. He does not use his gunboats; he keeps them in reserve. They are the police of the Malay Peninsula, the armed force which all friends of international arbitration desire to see behind the tribunal which is to cause wars to cease in the earth. Last week a dispute between the MAHARAJAH of Johore and two neighbouring potentates was amicably settled by his award, which, but for his intervention, would probably have resulted in a war.
