THE WAR IN THE MALAY PENINSULA.—This subject is treated of in a special article accompanying "Our Illustrations," but we may mention that the authorities are adopting energetic measures to punish the outrage. Troops have been dispatched from Calcutta and Hong Kong, and gunboats from the latter place, while further detachments are under orders to start from Calcutta if necessary. The Home Government has also taken steps to send troops out from England should they be wanted. In the meantime the Malays are stockaded within seven miles of the Residency, which is intrenched by the troops (numbering 800), who are awaiting reinforcements. The gunboats *Thistle* and *Fly* are also up the river. News of offensive operations may be expected to-day (Saturday). The Sultan Abdoolah has naturally promised every aid in his power, and the principal chiefs remain loyal.
