With the help of the Russian cable, news has been received from the Malay Peninsula bearing Sunday's date. It is extremely satisfactory, that is for the British, but not for the lawless Malays. It shows that the British troops at the Perak Residency, even before they were joined by the considerable reinforcements sent to their aid, were able to make a successful campaign against the rebels under Ismail Sultan, and this may be taken as proof of the failure of the Claimant's project to teach the Mohammedan Malays to regard him as a champion of their religion, and not simply as the promoter of designs for personal aggrandisement. Our quarrel in Perak is therefore still confined to the one which a disappointed Claimant of the Throne has raised with Abdoolah Sultan and his friends and allies equally with us.
